

Setting the language to Welsh in Windows (Windows PC on Campus)



To successfully change the default language of Windows to Welsh, please follow the steps below;

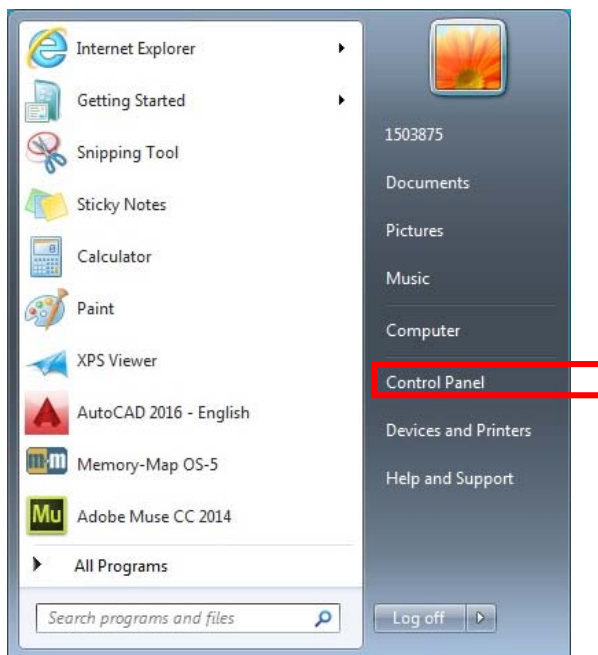
1. Login to the computer on campus.

NB. If you are already logged onto a campus computer, please ensure you save any work before proceeding.

2. Click on the **'Start'** button



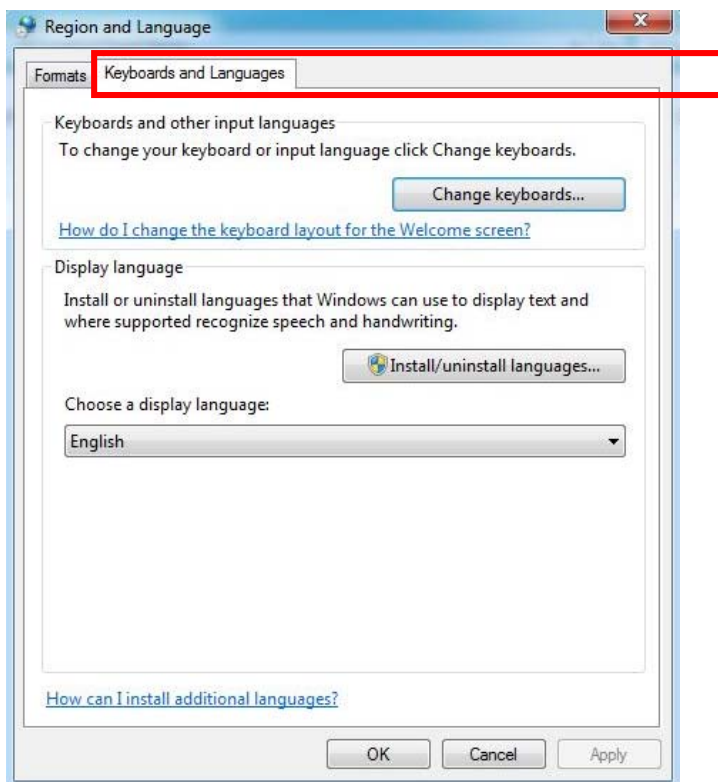
3. Click on **'Control Panel'**



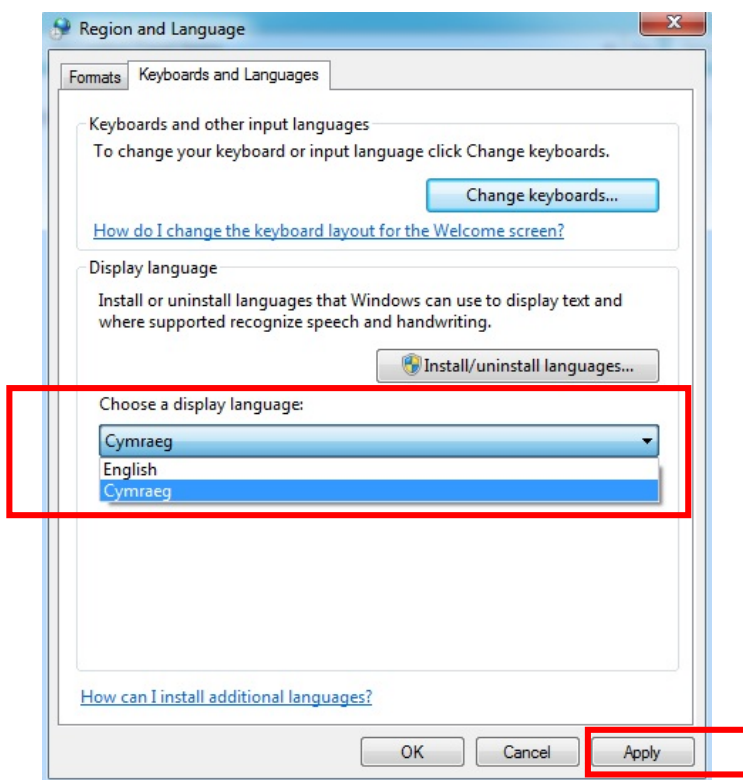
4. Click on **'Region and Language'**



5. Select the 'Keyboards and Languages' tab

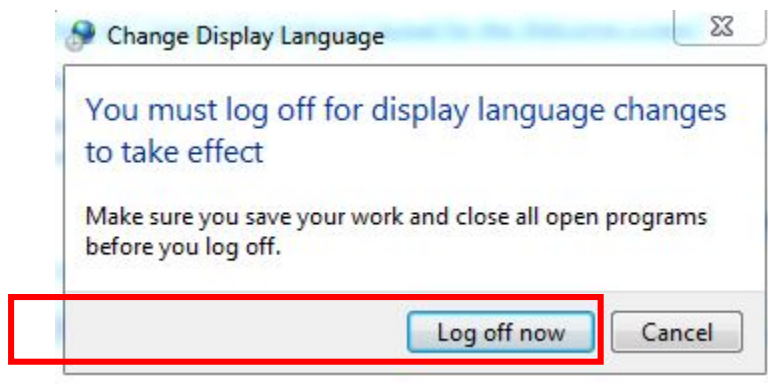


6. Under 'Choose a display language', select 'Cymraeg' from the drop down option



7. Click 'Apply'

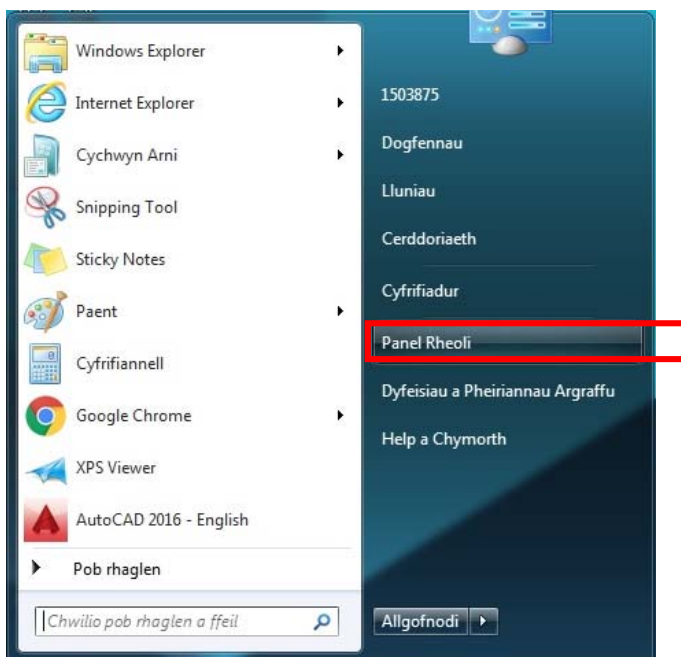
8. A separate window will pop-up, click 'Log off now'



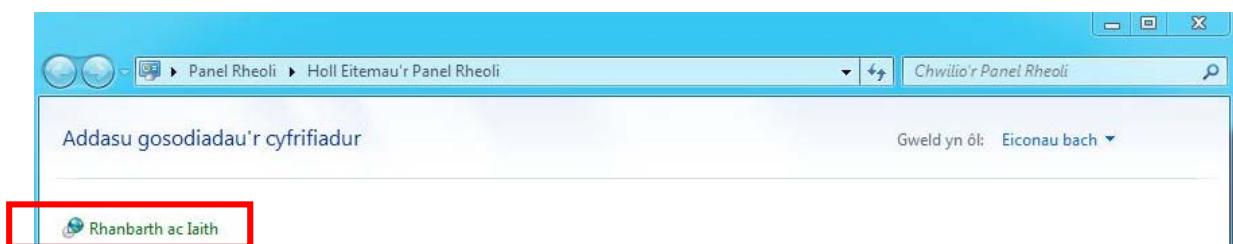
9. Finally, log back onto the same computer with the same credentials and the language will now be set to Welsh – Complete!

To revert Windows back to its original settings, please follow the steps below;

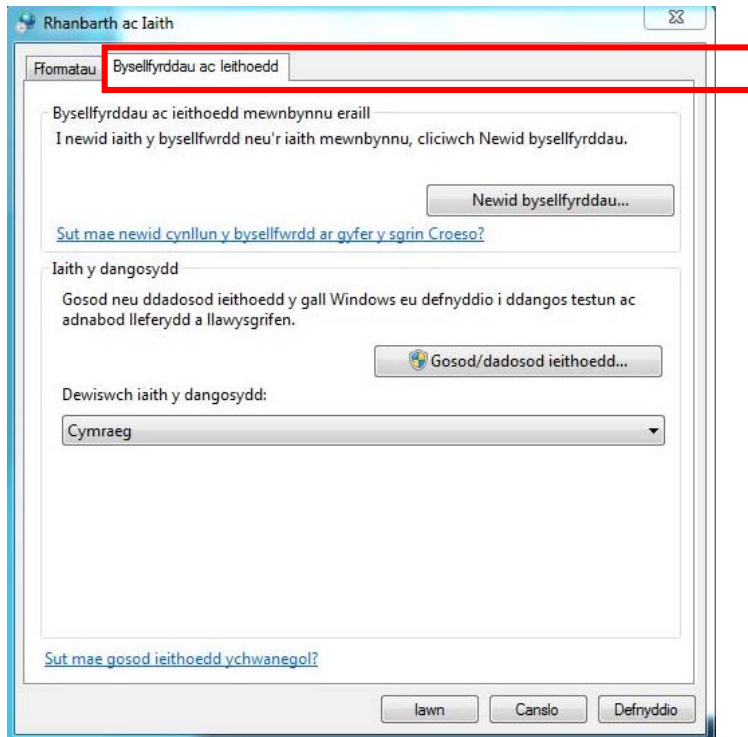
1. Click on 'Panel Rheoli'



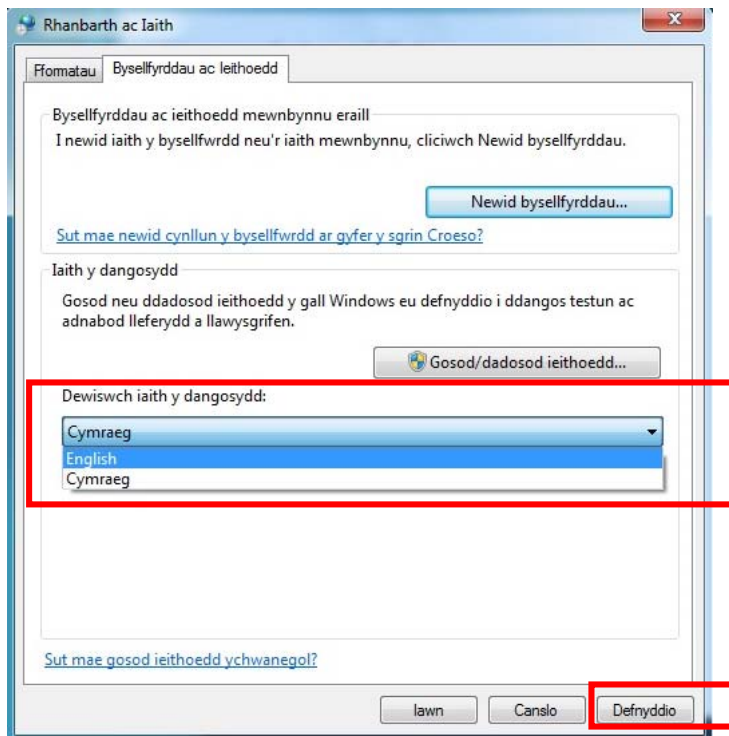
2. Click on 'Rhanbarth ac Iaith'



3. Select the 'Byselfyrddau ac ieithoedd' tab

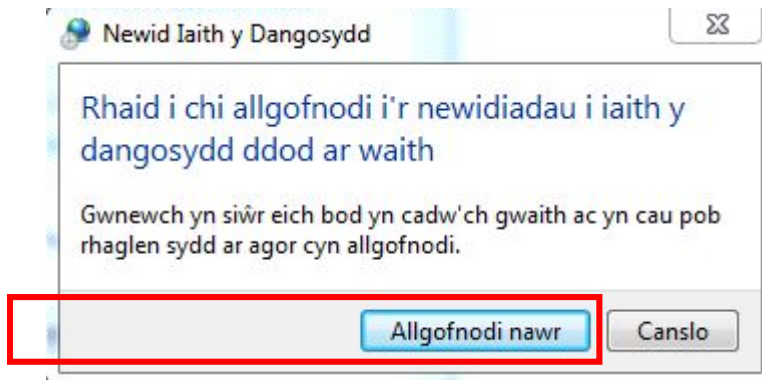


4. Under 'Dewiswch iaith y dangosydd', select 'English' from the drop down option

6. A separate window will pop-up, click '**Allgofnodi nawr**'



7. Finally, log back onto the same computer with the same credentials and the language will now be set to English.
